We operate a stringent and demanding recruitment process in order to select the highest quality, well-qualified and experienced staff who display absolute dedication to providing the highest standards in childcare and a genuine commitment to the safety, development and wellbeing of the children in their care.

The Red Balloon team has a broad range of skills and experience. A majority of the team hold qualified status (Montessori Teacher, NVQ3 or equivalent) and those who are not already qualified are currently working towards a qualification. All staff have access to diverse training opportunities in order to develop themselves as individuals and to achieve continuous improvement within the nursery.

At Red Balloon we try as a matter of principle to employ higher ratios of staff to children than those required by Ofsted. Our philosophy is the more hands on deck the better which means children in our care receive greater individual attention.

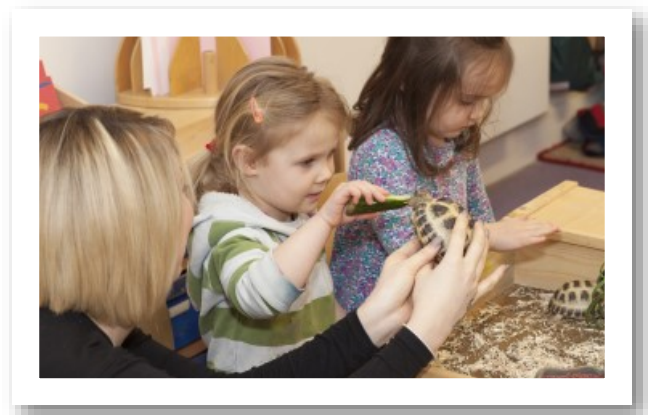
We have a policy to avoid using agency staff in order to ensure continuity of care for the children. To this end we have a fantastic support team who are able to assist when our permanent team members are ill or on holiday. Our support team work regularly in the nursery so their faces are

always familiar to the children and they understand fully how we work at Red Balloon.

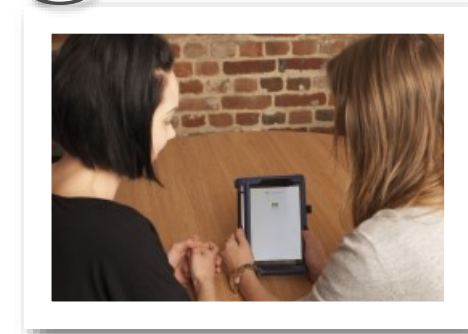
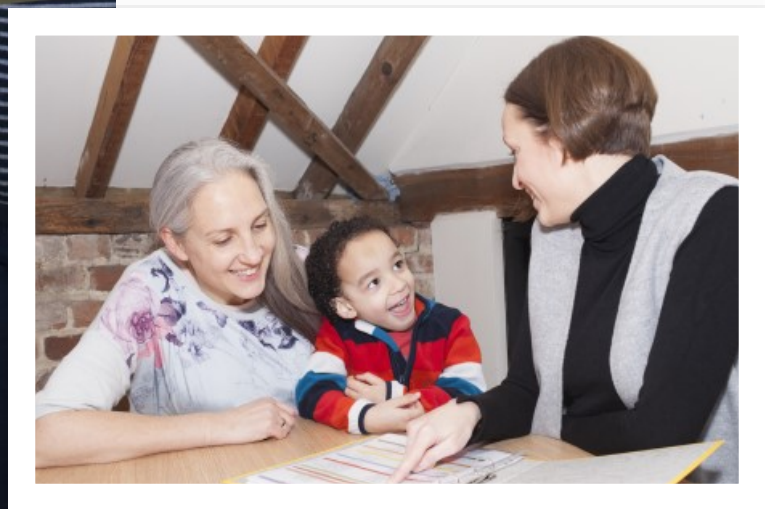
All staff are required to hold a recent first aid qualification and all staff are subject to police, health and reference checks.



At Red Balloon we believe parents are children's first and most enduring educators. We work in close partnership with parents and use parental knowledge and expertise to support the learning opportunities we provide.

We believe that good communication is key to developing good relationships. We operate an open door policy and parents are always welcome to discuss any issues relating to their child or the nursery at any time.

At Red Balloon we use Tapestry, an innovative and interactive online learning journal. Tapestry enables us to record, track and celebrate children's development: this unique journal is shared online with parents, who are able to see special moments and view their child's progress.



Each child is assigned to a key person who has responsibility for monitoring their progress and maintaining development records. We hold regular parents evenings which give you the opportunity to discuss your child's development profile with their key person.

We recognise that leaving a child at nursery for the first time is not easy and can be an unsettling time for both parents and children. We will try to ease this process by offering a complimentary settling in

period for your child which will comprise an unrestricted number of settling in sessions, including an initial introductory visit to your home, which will give you the opportunity to discuss your child's individual needs and routine with their key person.

The need to be kept informed is paramount to the standard of customer care and good quality practice within the nursery. General notices are displayed in the entrance hall and room-specific notices are displayed on the notice boards outside the rooms.

A newsletter is distributed weekly and our popular ClarionCall system enables us to communicate with parents day-to-day by email and text.

Parents are invited to attend various information evenings throughout the year as well as bi-annual Parent Consultation Group forums which give us the opportunity to seek parents' views and to share our plans.

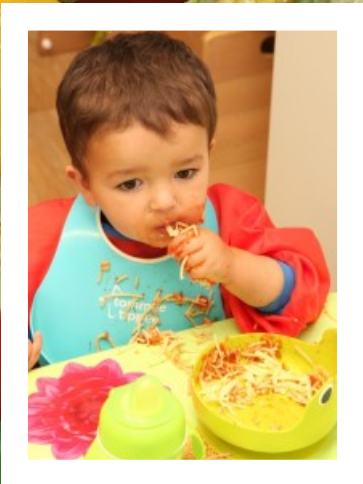
You Are What You Eat

At Red Balloon we believe children should eat a wholesome, balanced diet.

Our healthy and nutritious meals are home-cooked on site using fresh produce. All our meat and poultry is sourced from local producers and suppliers and is of exceptional quality. We always use free range eggs and organic milk supplied by West Horsley Dairies.



As a nursery we believe that we have an ideal opportunity to help every child eat well, enjoy a varied diet and establish healthy eating habits to take with them into their school years. We follow the Children's Food Trust voluntary guidelines - Eat Better, Start Better - in order to provide healthy, balanced and nutritious food and drink. Encouraging children to eat well and learn about food in their early years not only protects their health when they are young, but also sets the foundations for their future health and wellbeing.

The cultural background and dietary requirements of every child is fully respected and we work with parents to ensure that their child's individual needs are catered for.

At Red Balloon we enjoy mealtimes as happy, social and relaxed occasions. Breakfast is served between 08.00 and 08.30, lunch at 12.00 and tea at 16.30. Children are offered a mid-morning and a mid-afternoon snack comprising for example home-baked biscuits and fruit.

Children are encouraged to try different things and to develop good table manners. We introduce children to tastes of different cultures and encourage them to develop their own culinary skills in regular cooking sessions.

Red Balloon is a tooth-friendly nursery. We promote good dental health by minimising sugar in our menu, offering healthy snack choices and cleaning teeth after meals. Good habits last a lifetime.

We are proud to hold a Food Hygiene Rating of 5, Very Good, the highest achievable score.

The Nest accommodates 12 children aged from 3 to 18 months.

The Nest has an intimate, cherishing atmosphere simply bursting with hugs and cuddles. In The Nest we mirror the routine enjoyed by your child at home thus ensuring a gentle transition from home to nursery.

The children are encouraged to learn through play and are offered a whole host of opportunities to explore through a wide variety of exciting (and sometimes extremely messy!) experiences.

The Nest is fully equipped with en-suite nappy changing facilities, an adjoining milk kitchen and an adjacent sleeping room which provides a tranquil setting for peaceful slumber. A fenced-off garden area accessed directly from the room gives plenty of opportunities for fresh air and safe outdoor fun.





The Dairy accommodates 16 children ranging in age from 18 to 30 months.

The Dairy provides a fun and stimulating playing and learning environment which matches activities to age and ability and allows children to develop at their own pace, to investigate their interests and to play safely.

Children in The Dairy follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. During their time in here we aim to put all the small steps in place to support children to become secure, happy, keen and confident learners. Our carefully designed programme of activities continues to be delivered for the most part through play.

Children in The Granary continue to follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum but it is at this stage of the children's development that we start to introduce them to Montessori materials and to the Montessori approach

The Stables accommodates 18 children aged 3 to 5 years, a majority of whom are completing their final year at Martyr's Green prior to Reception year entrance at Big School: children are encouraged to adopt practices and behaviours which will equip them well in preparation for their transition to a school environment.

Communication and language development involves giving children opportunities to experience a rich language environment; to develop their confidence

and skills in expressing themselves; and to speak and listen in a range of situations.

Physical development involves providing opportunities for young children to be active and interactive; and to develop their coordination, control, and movement. Children must also be helped to understand the importance of physical activity, and to make healthy choices in relation to food.

Personal, social and emotional development involves helping children to develop a positive sense of themselves, and others; to form positive relationships and develop respect for others; to develop social

skills and learn how to manage their feelings; to understand appropriate behaviour in groups; and to have confidence in their own abilities.

In this age group we also focus increasingly on four specific areas which are Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the world and Expressive arts and design.

Following the Montessori philosophy, we aim to provide an environment which includes all aspects of learning - intellectual, physical, emotional and social. We aim to enable a child's confidence to develop through freedom and independence within the Stables.

At Red Balloon we offer a diverse selection of extra-curricular activities ranging from Ballet to French, Footie to Drama.



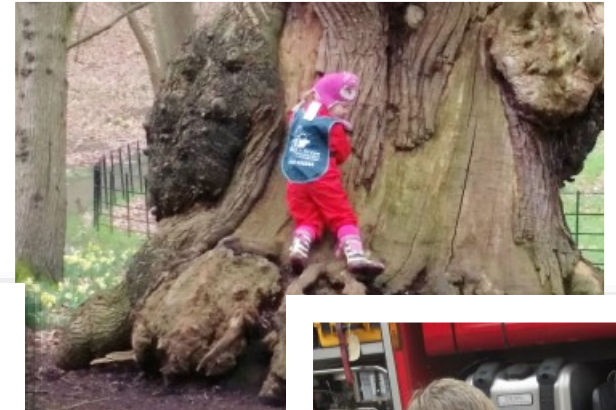

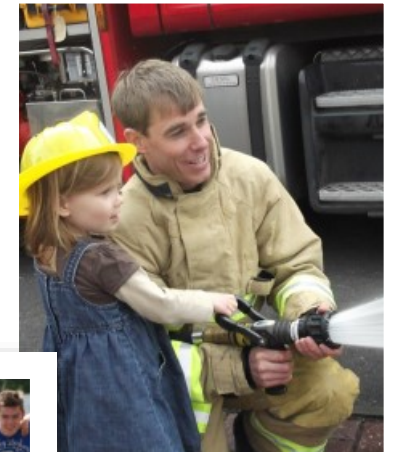

At Red Balloon we take a unique child-initiated approach which effectively delivers the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

Every child deserves the best possible start in life and the support that enables them to fulfil their potential. Children develop quickly in the early years and a child's experiences between birth and age five have a major impact on their future. Good parenting and high quality early learning together provide the foundation children need to make the most of their abilities and talents as they grow up.

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) sets the standards that we must meet to ensure that children learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe. It promotes teaching and learning to ensure children's 'school readiness' and gives children the broad range of knowledge and skills that provide the right foundation for good future progress through school and life.

The learning and development requirements cover the seven areas of learning and development – Communication and language, Physical development, Personal, social and emotional development, Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the world and Expressive arts and design - which shape activities and experiences for children; each area of learning is underpinned by early learning goals, the knowledge, skills and understanding children should have at the end of the academic year in which they turn five and assessment arrangements are in place to measure progress.

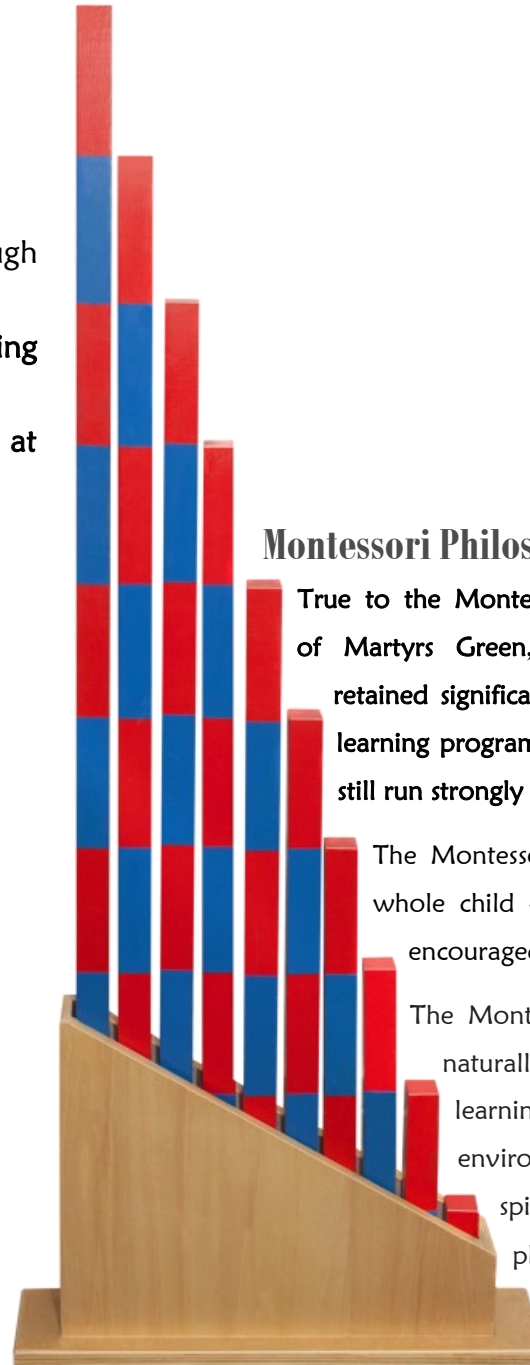


Four guiding principles shape our delivery of the EYFS:

Montessori Philosophy

True to the Montessori legacy of Martyrs Green, we have

retained significant aspects of the Montessori approach within our learning programme and the threads of the Montessori philosophy still run strongly through the nursery.

The Montessori approach is holistic and aims to develop the whole child - each child here is treated as an individual and encouraged to achieve their fullest potential.

The Montessori approach views each child as one who is naturally eager for knowledge and capable of initiating learning in a supportive, thoughtfully prepared learning environment. It is an approach that values the human spirit and the development of the whole child—physical, social, emotional and cognitive.
